

## 2017 Call for papers

We are happy to announce that submissions are now open for the 13th Annual NeuroPsychoEconomics Conference in **Antwerp, Belgium**. The conference will be held on **June 8-9, 2017** at the city campus of the University of Antwerp (Convention Hall, The Grauwzusters Cloister, Lange Sint-Annastraat 7, 2000 Antwerpen, Belgium).

The conference chairs are Carolyn Declerck and Christophe Boone. The **deadline for submissions** is <u>April 15, 2017</u>.

The conference theme of 2017 is:

## "Neuroeconomic foundations of bounded rationality and heuristic decision making"

Topics preferably combine problems in economics, psychology, and/or neuroscience, and include (but are not restricted to):

- **Opening the "black box" of judgments and decision making.** Understanding how strategic incentives, emotions, and contextual influences transform "Economic Man" to a boundedly rational and flexible problem solver, amenable to change. For example: what factors affect risk-taking behaviors, self-control, time discounting, or the outcome of social interactions?
- Studies on individual differences and values that affect choice behavior. For example, what is the influence of personality, gender, political ideology, or social preferences on decision making? And how does behavioral heterogeneity affect the aggregate outcome in organizations or competitive markets?
- **Applications** of research in behavioral- and neuroeconcomics in different management domains, finance, marketing, law, or translational medicine; discussion of possible ethical/legal issues that emerge from such applications.
- **Methodological presentations** on state of the art investigations in decision neuroscience. For example: fMRI, TMS, DTI, EEG/ERP, genetics, and endocrinological studies.

Both empirical and conceptual manuscripts are welcome.

## Competitive paper submissions

- Papers for the 2017 NeuroPsychoEconomics Conference must be submitted by April 15, 2017. The submission website can be found at http://www.jnpe.org (under "Conference" and "Submissions").
- Submissions can either consist of a full paper of up to 40 double-spaced pages <u>or</u> an extended abstract of up to 1,500 words.
  - Full paper submissions (up to 40 double-spaced pages) must include a short abstract of no more than 350 words (for inclusion in the "NeuroPsychoEconomics Conference Proceedings," ISSN 1861-8243) and conform to the author guidelines of the American Psychological Association (APA). Your cover letter needs to indicate whether or not you intend to publish the full paper, if accepted, in the "Journal of Neuroscience, Psychology, and Economics" (ISSN 1937-321X). Please see http://www.jnpe.org (under "Conference" and "Submissions") for more submission information.
  - Extended abstract submissions (up to 1,500 words) will go through an expedited review process and should go beyond a research proposal (i.e., empirical extended abstracts should present information on data and results, conceptual extended abstracts should clearly state their theoretical contribution). Extended abstract submissions must include a short abstract of no more than 350 words (for inclusion in the "NeuroPsychoEconomics Conference Proceedings," ISSN 1861-8243) and conform to the author guidelines of the American Psychological Association (APA). Please see http://www.jnpe.org (under "Conference" and "Submissions") for more submission information.
- Your cover letter must include the full names and affiliations of all coauthors as well as the e-mail address of the corresponding author. The cover letter also needs to specify whether you intend to give a talk or a poster presentation (more on poster submissions below).
- In submitting a paper, the authors affirm that, if accepted, <u>at least one author</u> will register for the 2017 NeuroPsychoEconomics Conference and appear at the conference to present the paper.

## Poster submissions

- Poster proposals for the 2017 NeuroPsychoEconomics Conference must be submitted by April 15, 2017.
- Poster proposals will go through an expedited review process. Your poster proposal is an extended abstract (up to 1,500 words) that describes the research presented on the poster, and a short abstract (up to 350 words) for inclusion in the "NeuroPsychoEconomics Conference Proceedings," ISSN 1861-8243. The extended abstract for the poster submissions must conform to the author guidelines of the American Psychological Association (APA). Please see http://www.jnpe.org (under "Conference" and "Submissions") for more submission information.
- Your cover letter must include the full names and affiliations of all coauthors as well as the e-mail address of the corresponding author. The cover letter also needs to specify whether you intend to give a poster presentation or a talk (more on submissions for talks in a competitive paper session above).
- If your proposal gets accepted, posters to be presented at the conference may have a maximum size of 120 cm (height) x 90 cm (width).
- The best posters may be invited for presentation in a special session at the conference (10 minutes verbal presentation).
- In submitting a poster proposal, the authors affirm that, if accepted, at least one author will register for the 2017 NeuroPsychoEconomics Conference and appear at the conference to present the poster.
